With respect, I would like to report on the background of my traitorous networks, and my strategically traitorous deeds committed at my base.

- My strings of traitorous deeds in the past:
- In 1959: I came to Phnom Penh for the first time. I was influenced by the traitorous environment of The People Group Newspaper; however, I was not on assignment yet.
- In 1960: I was involved in the network of *Bang Yèm* (ប៉េងម៉ែម) who then introduced me to the Revolutionary Progressive Youth at Yukunthor (យុកុនតូរ) School.
- In 1961: *Bang Yèm* assigned and introduced me to Comrade HING Phan (ហ៊ីងផាន) who was still in the Revolutionary Progressive Youth.
- In 1962: Comrade HING Phan assigned and introduced me to Comrade HUON Kiet (ហួនកៀត), through whom I came to know Comrade DĂM Phēng (ដាំផែង). He then assigned me to become a member of the Revolutionary Progressive Youth. I agreed to this assignment.
- In 1962: A KÈV Meas (កែវមាស) provided me with education and propaganda on traitorous activities against the Revolution at my uncle's house.
- In early 1963, through my uncle, I became a member of the traitorous network of the CIA in order to camouflage myself amongst the Revolutionary members, and in pursuit of destroying the Revolution. He told me, "In the future, if someone comes to liaise with you, please acknowledge his or her networks. If you can get along with him or her, you do not need to liaise with

me anymore.” At that time, I assumed that probably A Ya (အိၤ) would come to communicate with me.

With respect, I would like to report on the detailed background of my traitorous activity lines in the past

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- In 1962: A KÈV Meas came to live at my uncle's house (from March ... August/1962). At that time my uncle continually provided me with education and propaganda about the traitorous influence working against the Revolution. Because he was sought to be arrested by spies, A KÈV Meas had escaped the house and I only met him again in the forest at Office 10 in September or October 1964.
  
- In 1963: in early 1963, through my uncle, I joined the CIA. My uncle told me, "This is your future. In the future, someone will contact you, so please acknowledge him or her. If you can get along with him or her, please report to me; and from that time, you do not need to contact me any longer." At that time I thought probably A Ya and his networks would come to liaise with me. Unexpectedly, in May 1963, *Bang* "Khâ" ("Ø") came to communicate with me instead. He reported to me in detail about the entire situation in the past. I then totally agreed to his assignment. As instruction against the Revolution, he encouraged me to be a "leftist" in order to push forwards, to impress the enemies, and to destroy the enemies' forces. In the meantime, he advised me, "It is superb that you are already in the Revolution; the harder you work to camouflage yourself in the Revolution, the better you are." At that time, I tried my best to comply entirely with his instruction.

I would like to report on the background of my family, parents and siblings as follows:

1- Siblings:

I have five siblings.

First, my elder brother named SÂMRET Sâm OI (សំរិត សំរុល) alias Chroek (ច្រីក), 38 years old. Currently he is in Kôk Trea (គោកទ្រា) cooperative, Prey Chhor (ព្រៃឈរ) commune, Prey Chhor district, Kampong Cham province.

He came to live in Phnom Penh one year before me. He also lived with my uncle. He studied at Kampuch Botr (កម្ពុជបុត្រ) School (a private school). From what I remember, because he was weak in the class and my father was unable to support his schooling, he quit his studies when he was in grade five. Then he started script moulding and typing class, and got a job as script moulder and messenger for the *Observateur* Newspaper (I am not sure about the year).

Then, the enemies invaded and closed down the newspaper; and some workers were arrested. At that moment, he managed to escape quickly, and quit his job there. As I remember, he worked as a construction worker for a while; he lived and worked at a construction site. A while later, he worked as a blacksmith making steel doors – windows, and set up these doors-windows at bricked flats. His work and business then was only as a steel worker. As I remember, probably in early 1964 or at the end of

1964, my father asked him to come back and run a business in his hometown (unsure); and he also wanted to get married then.
