1. THE PRE-TRIAL CHAMBER of the Extraordinary Chambers in the Courts of Cambodia ("ECCC") has received an Application dated 7 September 2009 from the Cambodian Center for Human Rights, requesting leave to file an amicus curiae brief pursuant to Internal Rule 33 "to assist the Pre-Trial Chamber in determining or not to uphold the Office of the Co-Investigating Judges Order on Use of Statements which were or may have been obtained by torture dated 28 July 2009."

2. Rule 33(1) of the Internal Rules provides:

"At any stage of the proceedings, the Co-Investigating Judges or the Chambers may, if they consider it desirable for the proper adjudication of the case, invite or grant leave to an organization or person to submit a written amicus curiae brief concerning any issue. The Co-Investigating Judges and the Chambers concerned shall determine what time limits, if any, shall apply to the filing of such briefs."

- 3. The Pre-Trial Chamber finds that through the submissions of the Parties to the Appeal, the Chamber is sufficiently informed in order to decide on the Appeal. The Pre-Trial Chamber further finds that it would be undesirable to risk delaying the proceedings by receiving an amicus curiae brief and responses thereto by the Parties. The Pre-Trial Chamber has classified the documents in this procedure as confidential and, therefore, it would be impossible for the amicus to make submissions directed to the appeal which would not be of a general nature and speculative as to the grounds of the appeal.
- 4. The Pre-Trial Chamber appreciates the interest shown by the abovementioned organization in the current proceedings, but does not consider it desirable to grant leave to file an *amicus curiae* brief in this case.
