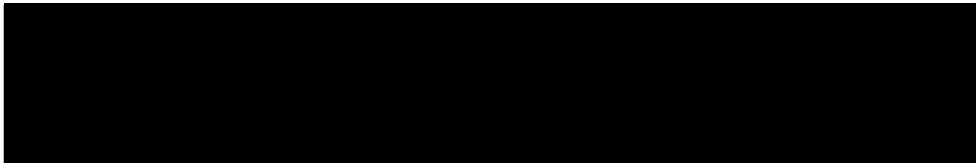

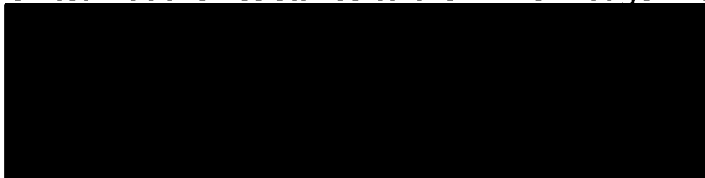
Dear parties,

WESU, on behalf of the Trial Chamber, has since ascertained that Professor Chandler is able to defer his arrival in Phnom Penh and his testimony will therefore commence on Wednesday 18 July 2012. He will remain in Phnom Penh for a portion of the following week to allow his testimony to conclude. In an effort to make up time, the Chamber will almost certainly sit on Friday 20 July, in accordance with earlier orders.

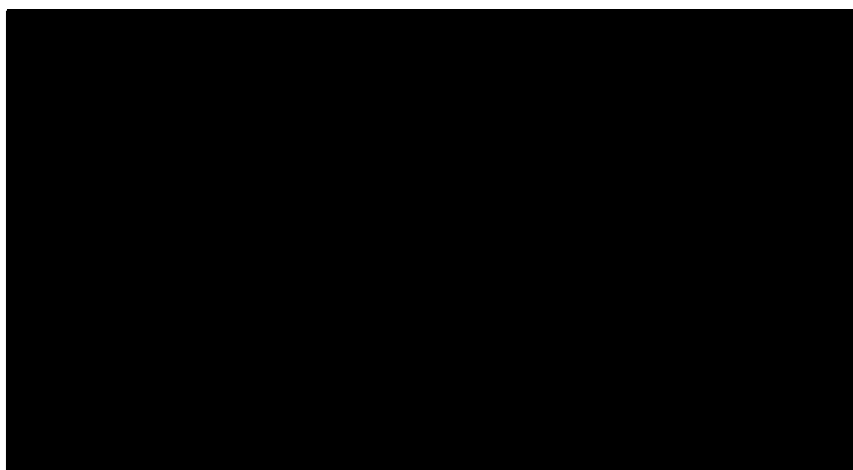

Chandler

Dear Susan and Trial Chamber

I have resent this as the header on the previous email was incorrect.

Due a medical emergency involving the prosecution advocate who has been assigned the examination of Professor David Chandler, the Co-Prosecutors request a brief delay to the start of Professor Chandler's examination - to **Wednesday, 18 July 2012**. The advocate concerned suffered a severe knee injury and underwent surgery in Bangkok last week. He was expected back in Phnom Penh this week but his recovery has been delayed. He is now expected back in Cambodia by Monday or Tuesday. A back-up plan has been put in place to cover the possibility of the advocate not returning within the expected time frame.

We understand the importance of moving the trial forward as expeditiously as possible, however, in light of the detailed nature of his testimony and the unexpected nature of the circumstances we hope this request can be accommodated.
