

## Report

To: Beloved Comrade UM Kít, Tram Kàk district

The biography of Chàk (ចាក់), the enemy connection, is as the following:

Father's name: Oen (អ៊ិន); Mother's name: Yân (យ៉ន); Two children: One son and one daughter; Place of birth: Prey Kuy village.

In the five-year war with the imperialists and the traitors, he and his parents lived in the town of Takeo (តាកែវក្រុង) near Bânteay Châk. During the day, he pedalled a bicycle rickshaw. At night, he guarded.

In the town of Takeo three months before the Americans lost the war, he educated boys and girls, gave them candy and cakes, clothes, soap, and asked them to remember his good deeds. He left for three months and returned.

After liberation, the Kampuchean revolutionary organization had him to go to Baray commune. Chàk, his parents and members of his family went to Baray commune. When Torn (ទ័ន) and Chàk talked about running to Baray and living in Spean Thmei, Torn obtained dry rice from Ta Choek (តាច្នឹក) and split it with Chàk and began to talk about Torn running to Popel commune by looking which route take and how to go.

This was the discussion between Torn, Chàk, and Ta Choek. So, request to send this one according to the confession of the enemy to Angkar for continued questioning and decision in accordance with its examination and judgment.

## Report

Respectfully report to the Party for the month of July 1977 as follows:

1. Politics: One study meeting was held for both the progressives and the masses. No negative phenomena have appeared.
2. Eighteen prisoners entered during July 1977. In total, there are 81 prisoners.

Two died from illness.

39 were swept away [ប្រាសសំអាត]

40 remain, including both old and new prisoners.

3. Daily living: 1,010 cans of rice were consumed, including the entire office, equal to 40 buckets; 92 cans of salt were consumed.
4. On economics: planted 30 palm trees, sowed 37 buckets of early and late rice, dismantled a number of paddy dikes and prepared the land for cultivation, sewed 166 pieces of thatches, planted 200 bunches of rice seedlings.

This is all for the report of the month of July 1977.

Planted 12 coconut trees, banana trees [illegible].
