Record of the Death of Ms IENG Thirith

On 22 August 2015 at 6.20 a.m. Ms IENG Thirith's family telephoned the Hospital's Deputy Head to request medical staff to provide emergency medical rescue for her. The physician arrived at 6.30 a.m. and the patient had been in a coma with BP of 80/60mmhg, O2Sat of 89 percent, pulse of 114/m and respiratory rhyme of 8/m. The physician provided rescue by doing CPR and using emergency drugs. The procedure had lasted three hours, but the patient remained in cardiac arrest. Next, an ambulance from the Bangkok Hospital Branch in Chathaburi Province arrived at 9.30 a.m. to pick up the patient, but her medical conditions were so serious that a decision was made to continue with the onsite emergency procedure. From 9.35 a.m. to 10.45 a.m., a defibrillator had been used six times and the CPR procedure had been on-going, nevertheless failing to resuscitate her heart and other signs of life. As a result, the physician determined that she died at 10.45 a.m.

Her family, when being asked about her condition, said that from the previous evening to the early morning at 6.00 a.m. she was alright, and that only at 6.20 a.m. did her condition change. She coughed three times and then fell unconscious.

The doctor has concluded that Ms IENG Thirith died of cardiac arrest. It is noted that the patient had suffered from chronic medical conditions (cardiac function, chronic renal disorder and high blood pressure for many years), and that before her death, she had been bed-ridden and assisted by oxygen inhalation on a daily basis.
