Subject: Re: Co-Prosecutors Leave to Reply to Leng Sary and Nuon Chea's Responses to the Co-Prosecutors Motion for Reconsideration of the Terms of the Severance Order with Khmer translation

Dear Co-Prosecutors,

As you know, the Chamber recently announced the date of commencement of the hearing of evidence in Case 002. The points highlighted in your mail do not raise any issues of novelty which have not already been weighed by the Chamber both in its original Severance Order and in its pending decision on the request that it now be reconsidered, issuance of which is now imminent. Leave to reply is denied, in the interests of safeguarding the Chamber's ability to adhere to its schedule as announced and to commence the trial on the substance during 2011.

For future reference, there is no need to utilize the scarce translation resources at the disposal of your office to transmit emails to me in both Khmer as well as English. The purpose of allowing informal notifications to the Trial Chamber SLO in relation to trial management matters was precisely to alleviate these constraints and to avoid considerable wastage of time and effort.

You are also requested to remove the judges' names from future correspondence of this sort, which is in clear breach of earlier directions given to the parties.
