

STATEMENT BY MR CHAU SENG,
MEMBER OF THE POLITBURO OF THE FUNK CENTRAL COMMITTEE AND SPECIAL ENVOY
TO EUROPE OF THE CAMBODIAN HEAD OF STATE

Following the liberation of Kampuchea from the aggression of the American imperialists, an all-out misinformation campaign was launched against the people of Cambodia, and especially regarding the “refugees” currently on the premises of what was formerly the “embassy” of France to the clique of traitors in Phnom Penh.

We wish to begin by pointing out that, as highlighted in the 28 April 1975 communiqué of the GRUNC Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the GRUNC is not replacing the clique of traitors in the Government of Kampuchea. As a consequence, all the diplomatic and consular missions, as well as all organs accredited to the clique, should not ask our government to accord them benefits in the form of privileges and immunity as recognised in the diplomatic conventions. The staff of those missions and of bodies accredited to the traitors’ clique will be treated as ordinary foreign nationals in a sovereign, independent country.

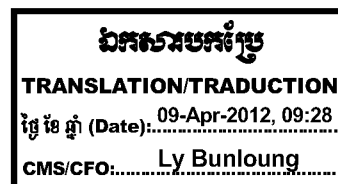
We wish to inform the general public about the presence of war criminals on the premises of what was formerly the “embassy” of France, including Sirik, the traitor, who was sentenced by the Second Congress of Kampuchea, as well as hundreds of other individuals who committed countless crimes against the people of Cambodia.

We strongly condemn the foreign interference in our country’s internal affairs. We believe that legitimate and reasonable to ask that the traitors be turned over to the competent authorities of our country.

We once again wish to reaffirm that the FUNK, the GRUNC and the FAPLNK will not tolerate any espionage, subversive or sabotage activity, including where such activity is disguised as humanitarian aid, assistance or cooperation.

On this occasion, we wish to emphasise that our policies, both domestic and foreign, remain unchanged. At the international level, we will endeavour to expand our circle of friends and to cooperate with all countries on all the continents which scrupulously respect our country’s independence and sovereignty and do not interfere in our internal affairs, based on the principle of equality and mutual interest.
